Report of the subcommittee

Draft report of the Subcommittee meetings of the Committee of Permanent Representatives

1. Since the 173rd quarterly meeting of the Committee of Permanent Representatives (CPR, the Committee), held on 20 April 2026, two meetings of the subcommittee of the Committee have taken place. 2. At the [subcommittee meeting held on 30 April 2026](#):
 - a. Members of the Committee considered a briefing on the outcomes of the first part of the first session of the Plenary of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Panel on Chemicals, Waste and Pollution, followed by briefings on the outcomes of the twentieth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES CoP20), including potential linkages between its outcomes and UNEP's Programme of Work; and on the outcomes of the twelfth session of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES 12).
 - b. Several questions were raised by members of the Committee on the items considered at the meeting, to which the respective Secretariats provided responses.

3. At the [subcommittee meeting held on 14 May 2026](#):
 - a. Members heard a briefing on lessons learned from the seventh edition of the Global Environment Outlook (GEO-7) process as input for UNEP's future global

environmental assessment, followed by briefings on the 2026 World Environment Day campaign; working with finance ministries, regulators, commercial banks and insurers to better align the financial system with sustainable development priorities; the outcomes of the fifteenth session of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals (CMS COP15); and the Global Framework on Chemicals.
