

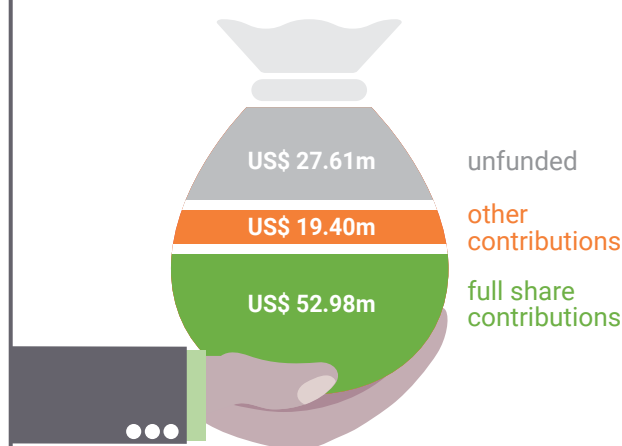

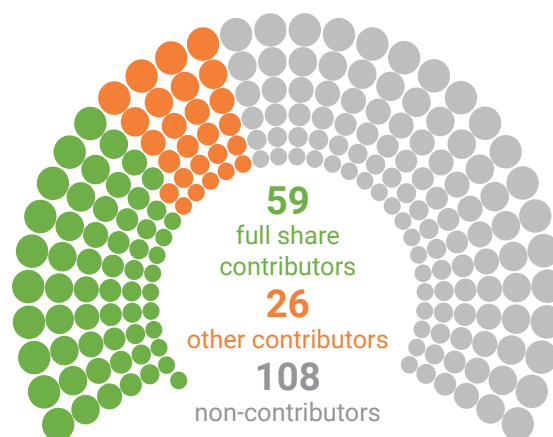

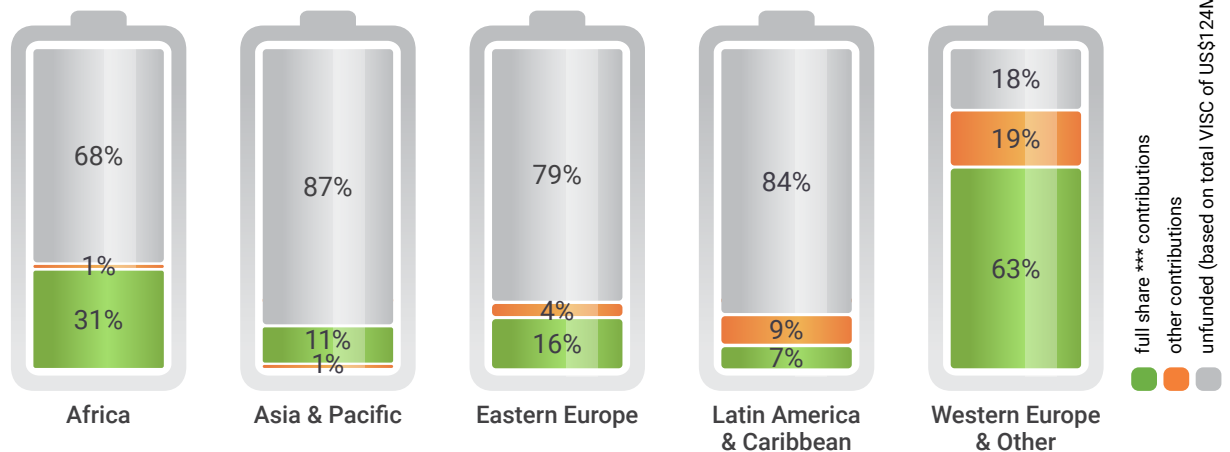

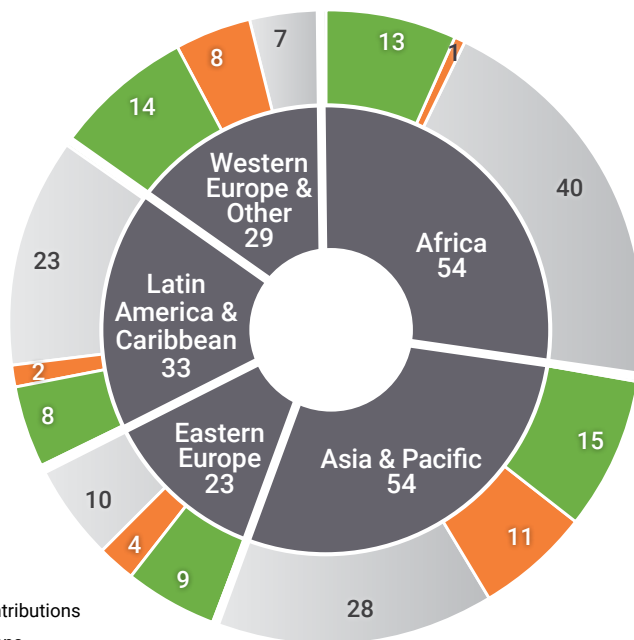

2025 Adaptation Gap Report: Running on Empty

Amid rising global temperatures and intensifying climate impacts, UNEP's **2025 Adaptation Gap Report: Running on Empty** warns that a widening finance gap is putting developing countries at risk. The report, supported by the Environment Fund, finds that at least US\$ 310 billion per year will be needed by 2035, yet current funding falls far short. Without urgent action, the Glasgow Climate Pact goal to double adaptation finance by 2025 will be missed. The report calls for stronger public-private investment and blended finance to close the gap and strengthen climate resilience.
