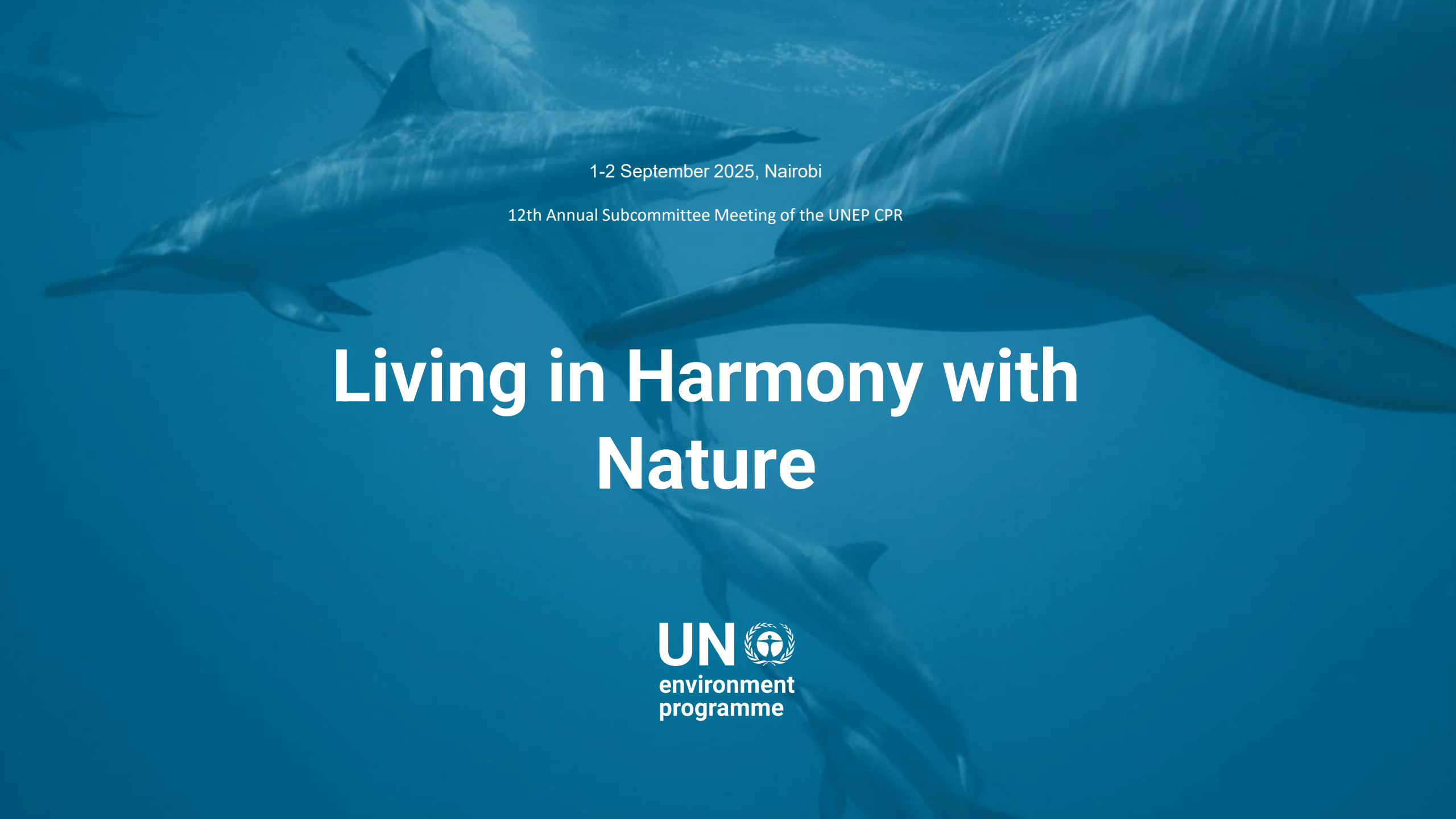

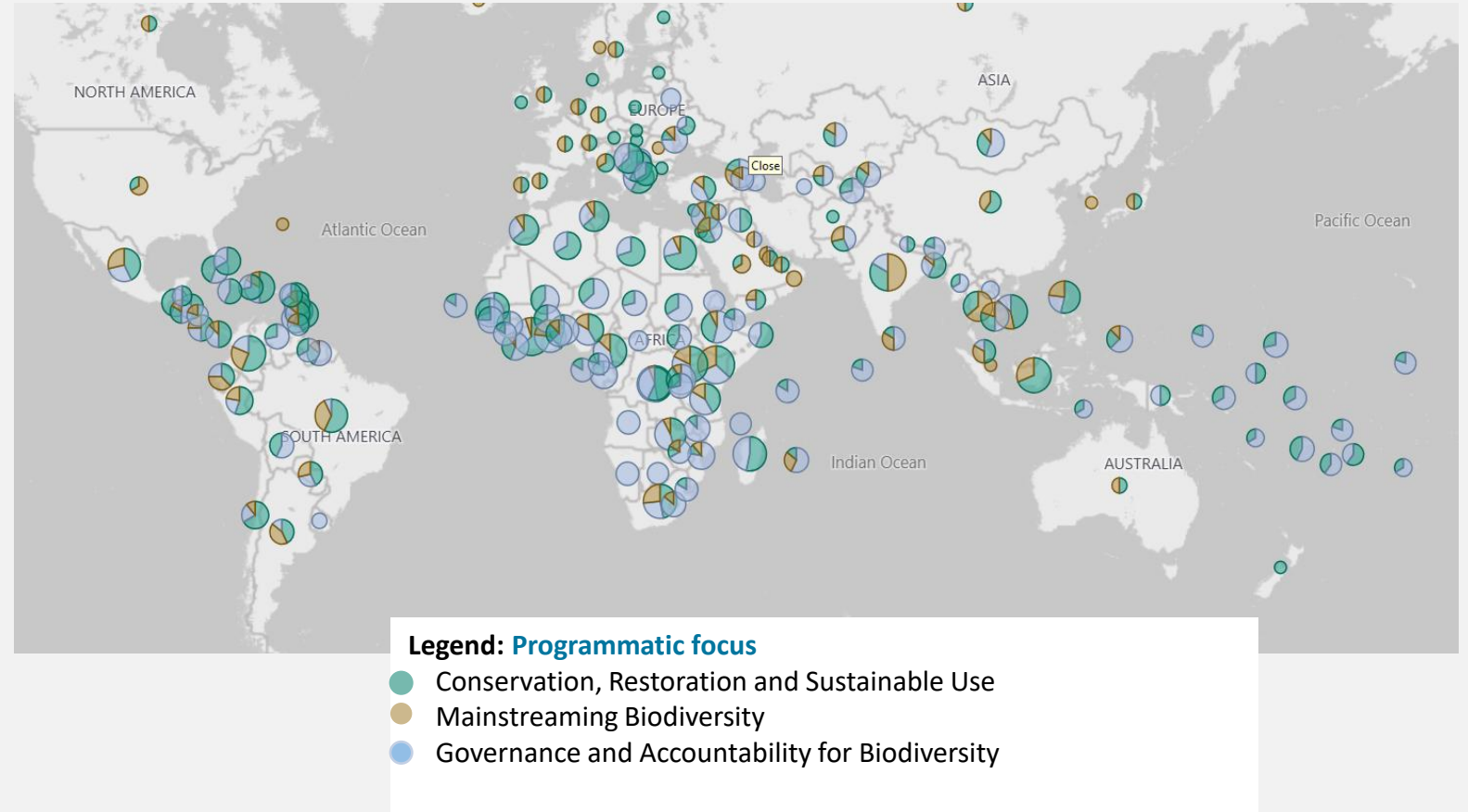
Living in harmony with nature strategic objective

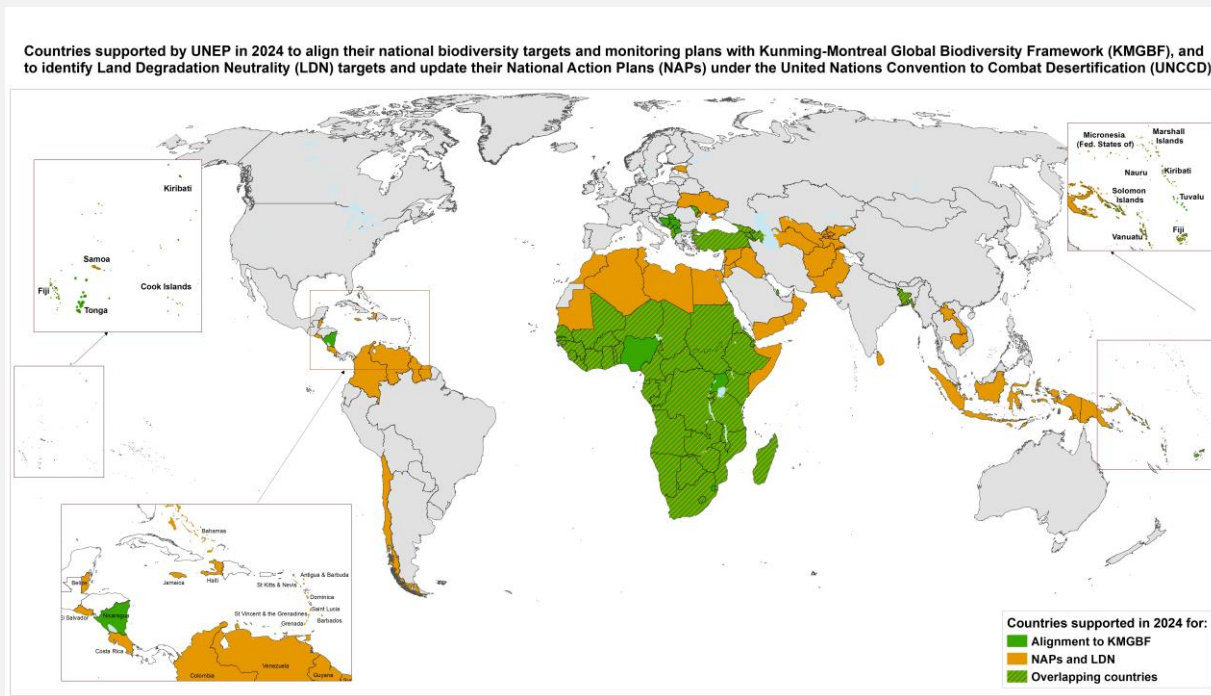
