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ANNOTATED PROVISIONAL AGENDA

1. Opening of the meeting and adoption of the agenda.

H. E. Mr. Sultan Hajiyeve, Chair of the Committee of Permanent Representatives (CPR), Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Azerbaijan to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), will open and chair the meeting. Delegations will be invited to adopt the provisional agenda.

2. Update on UNFCCC COP30 outcomes and impact on UNEP's climate action.

The Secretariat will provide an update on the main outcomes of the thirtieth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP30) of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, held in Belém, Brazil, from 10 to 21 November 2025, including a summary of negotiations, the Action Track and insights on impacts on UNEP's climate portfolio. The Committee will be invited to take note of the presentation and engage in an exchange of views with the members and the Secretariat.

3. Briefing on UNEP's work on addressing subsidies harmful to biodiversity.

Following the Committee's request during its 2025 review of UNEP's thematic programmes, the Secretariat will provide a briefing on its ongoing projects that address the issue of subsidies that are harmful to biodiversity and nature and promote sustainable incentives through analyses, campaigns and policy advocacy in line with Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (KMGBF) target 18. Key initiatives include developing methodologies for sustainable budgeting, supporting Member States in identifying and analysing existing finance mechanisms that cause harm to biodiversity, promoting nature-positive practices, and campaigns to reform harmful agricultural subsidies. The Committee is invited to take note of the presentation and engage in an exchange of views with the members and the Secretariat.

4. Other matters.

The meeting will consider any other matters related to its work.

5. Closing of the meeting.

The meeting is expected to close at 16:00 (GMT+3).
