UNEP's support to implement the COPs and their decisions

- Current GEF portfolio for Stockholm Convention: 160mil\$
- Harmful "forever chemicals" persist in our bodies and the environment. Over 9,000 tons to be eliminated with UNEP's portfolio
- Some of these chemicals are still in use in old electricity transmission networks or for malaria control even though available and economical alternatives exist
- UNEP developed an online integrated electronic toolkit: accessibility of consistent & updated National Implementation Plans data
- Addressing industrial POPs requires sector approaches through coordinated programmes

Looking forward

Sectoral approaches to support BRS Conventions and Global Framework on Chemicals implementation

- Chemical by chemical approaches alone inefficient to address the impact of pollution on health and the environment
- UNEP complements this approach by managing chemicals across key industry sectors: agrifood, buildings and construction, electronics, energy, plastics, textiles, transport, waste—along with mining value chain
- New markets for green chemicals and circular economies, particularly in product design, are showing new jobs and investment opportunities arising for countries
